CODE OF CONDUCT

As Adopted by the Administrative Team in August of 2002

SCA will follow the same code of conduct as the members of Sycamore Reformed Presbyterian Church are expected to maintain as outlined in The Constitution of the Reformed Presbyterian Church of North America. However, since this ministry of the church will involve having the youth of the church together for significant amounts of time each week, it is prudent to establish a few further "house rules" to clarify the behavior expected of the staff and students as outlined below.

Pastor/Instructors & Student Relationships

- To avoid even the appearance of evil or impropriety, the pastor and instructors will not meet privately with individual students apart from their parents.
- When a student misbehaves publicly in the classroom, the teacher will verbally correct him/her according to the Scriptural principles of Matthew 18:15 and II Timothy 2:24-25. If the misbehavior is repeated and habitual, the teacher will inform the parent of the student so that the parent can discipline the student. If the conduct of the student continues to create difficulty in the classroom, the Administrative Committee reserves the right to inform the parents and elders, and to remove the student from classes or the Academy itself.

Student-to-Student Relationships and Dress Code

- The students will regularly be encouraged to treat one another as brothers and sisters in the Lord. Such things as teasing, pranks, wrestling, jostling and coarse jesting will not be allowed and will be corrected as expressed above.
- Dating or any appearance thereof (pairing off, paying undue attention to one member of the opposite sex, giving notes, a boy regularly sitting by the same girl, etc.) is strictly forbidden.
- Though the students will not be expected to wear uniforms nor dress in uniformity, there will be a standard code of dress. Students should dress with their fellow students in mind. Shorts, short skirts or dresses, sloppy t-shirts, ripped clothing, and revealing clothing are prohibited. Young men should wear long slacks or nice jeans with an appropriate shirt; young ladies should wear slacks, jeans or skirts with modest tops.
